



RESOLUTION 14-1

In Honor and Memory of Dale Staley's Lifelong Commitment to Alaska CTE

WHEREAS, Dale Staley served as a dedicated board member and treasurer of Alaska ACTE in 2006-2008 and as an active member of the association for many years;

WHEREAS, Dale was an outstanding CTE leader for the Juneau School District and Alaska in his 40+ years of education service. Dale taught automotive classes and career education in Kansas and Pennsylvania; served as Executive Director of the Alaska State Advisory Council on Vocational and Career Education in 1974; served as Chief of Staff to Juneau's Representative and Senator Jim Duncan for 14 years; worked for the Southeast Regional Resource Center on Alaska Close Up, the Carl Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Consortium, and statewide school district facility educational specifications projects; served as Interim Director of the School of Career Education at UAS; and in Hydaburg for one year; and served in several administrative roles, including Principal and Assistant Principal in several of Juneau's elementary, middle and high schools for 15 years, until his untimely death in May 2014. Dale was also a two-term elected Juneau School Board member from 1989-1995.

Dale believed in "Service Above Self" and was a member of the Juneau Gastineau Rotary Club. He was a founding member of the Juneau Dipsticks, bringing his love of cars and education together through the Annual Juneau Dipsticks Classic, Custom & Antique Auto and Cycle Show, and created a scholarship fund now named in his memory, supporting youth interested in pursuing automotive related careers.

WHEREAS, Dale dedicated his career to career and technical education in Juneau and the state of Alaska;
