



Cost?

The cost to host an extern is \$3,000 plus any additional costs for travel and housing. We will work with you to tailor the externship program to your specific work environment and needs.



How to Host an Extern Signup as an industry participant!

Contact APICC at 770-5250

Develop a description of a project that will benefit your industry based upon your needs and your extern's skills.

(Visit www.apicc.org and look at the TIE Manual)

Discuss the project to be completed and determine a timeline with the extern.

Prepare for the externs arrival (outline expectations, assign personnel, make housing & travel arrangements, finalize schedule, and arrange workspace).

Possibly Attend orientation for Educators and Industry members with your extern.

Supervise extern during summer work assignment.

Assist the extern in applying ideas into classroom application (if needed).

Complete a survey upon completion of the project.

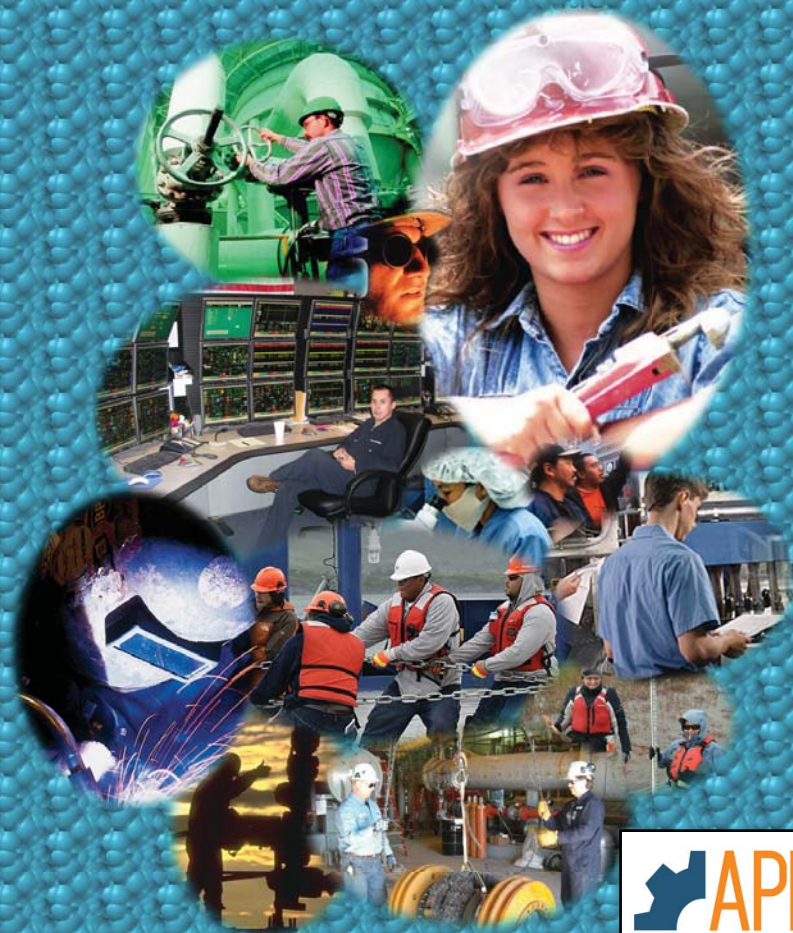
